

- 280 Park Units
- ▶ 80 million visitors annually
- 1.6 million acres
- 340 miles of coastline
- 5,200 miles of non-motorized trails
- ► 3,195 Historic Buildings
- 11,000 Prehistoric & Archaeological sites
- 15,000 camping & overnight accommodations

Climate Resilience



State Parks' stewardship work demonstrates the importance of actively protecting and managing lands so that those lands persist in a healthy state.

The Department has taken an approach to climate planning that underscores the need for climate change considerations to be embedded in everything we do.

The State Park System also offers opportunities to educate the public about the impacts of climate change and the importance of native habitats.

Wildfire and Forest Resilience and Ecosystem Management



- The Wildfire and Forest Resilience Program supports restoration and stewardship of fire-adapted ecosystems
- More than 100 parks will be treated to restore natural fire and reduce extreme wildfire
- Restoration efforts focus on ecological uplift: restoring natural processes and reducing stressors

Planning and Partnerships



- Develop consistent approaches to incorporating climate considerations into all park plans
- Integrate assessments of climate impacts and subsequent adaptation strategies
- Provide opportunities for partnerships with NGOs, Tribes, allied agencies, and others
- Parks CA supporting climate change fellows since 2022
